Stedman values are clear to see all over our school! We believe in RAPPS: <u>R</u>espect, <u>A</u>cting with good

character, <u>P</u>urpose, <u>P</u>ositive Attitude and <u>S</u>afety! We regularly recognize our Knights for their behavior and how they show these values during the school day. For example, Shout Outs are posted every week to recognize the ways our students and faculty live out RAPPS on a daily basis. We are also displaying student work that not only shows finished pieces, but the process of learning.

We also have some new staff I'd like to introduce you to. Lauren Culler, our Play Works Coach, leads structured playtime for students before school and during recess. We have also hired **Eno Ocansey**, a Restorative Approaches Coordinator, who will help support our efforts to build relationships, improve student behavior and positive school culture. Years of research has shown that it is more effective to encourage students to be accountable, leading to a community of caring and self-aware students.

Our new staff and recognizing our students for modeling our values has led to a decrease in discipline issues and we have only had two suspensions this year – a significant decrease from last year's 13 suspensions by the month of October. I want to thank all of our parents and families for their work in modeling our values and showing our students the importance of education. We encourage you to talk with your students about values and how you can be respectful, act with good character, purposeful, positive and safe at home as well as at school. 
