## **Preparing for CMAS/PARCC Test in March**

We will have CMAS/PARCC testing for our 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> graders throughout March. You can find helpful links to resources on our Stedman Website. Here are some tips for helping your child:

- Be encouraging! Ask how your child is feeling about taking assessments.
   Encourage your child to do his or her best.
- Help your child to get a good night's sleep, eat a good breakfast and be on time to school.
- Remind your child that testing is just one part of the day and one part of life.
- Do not schedule any appointments on the following days in March: 10-12, 17-19, 24, 25.

Please know that students will have to turn in their cell phones on testing days.
