
INSTRUCTIONAL SPOTLIGHT!

Students in Ms. Sahlin's 5th grade class

Ms. Sahlin's class recently learned about adaptation.

In birds and worms, the class examined four different colors of "worms" that would be scattered throughout the grass field. We made predictions about which color of worm would be easiest to spot in the grass. The students then did a relay race to find as many worms as possible. The students were the "birds" trying to catch one "worm" per trip.

After the race was over, the students tallied up their worms as a group and graphed their colors via a bar graph. We then discussed what inferences we had about which color worm would mate and live on, which color of worm would go extinct, and what further adaptations the worms would go through to
