A Historic Partnership with Kent Denver School and Stedman...

Collaboration!

A group of 20 seventh and eighth graders from Kent Denver School, have been working with Stacey Garcia and her classes for 10 years. The partnership that has been forged with Mrs. Garcia's classes and the students from Kent Denver School is built on experiential learning and making personal connections. Kent Denver students come to Stedman 4 to 5 times over the course of the school year to work with our students on reading, projects, science, and art. Our work together has been so successful that others have joined this year. Check out the recent collaboration with Ms. Malan's kindergarten class!

Kindergarten is studying nonfiction. Students in Ms. Malan's kindergarten class read The Pinata Maker as an example of a how to, nonfiction book. To inspire learning and to have the students prepared to write a how-to book, students created pinatas with paper mache with our Kent Denver buddies.

When the Kent Denver kids arrived they first helped students break apart a giant pinata. Then they went to the cafeteria to make their own. Drawing on their experiences actually making a pinata, students will next create their own How to Make a Pinata book in class.

An Update on Hiring:




Stedman honors Martin Luther King, Jr.
